AN ACT Relating to Fees Received by State Officials and Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 8-I, additional. Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 8-I to read as follows:

§ 8-I. Fees and receipts

All fees, charges, emoluments and other receipts of whatever nature, which may be payable to any state official or employee, excepting their lawful salaries and expenses properly payable to them, shall be credited to the General Fund and no state official or employee shall directly or indirectly receive a private benefit or gain from the sale or distribution of any material, information or reports from state records.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that if any state official or employee sells or receives moneys for information taken from state records or otherwise sells material or reports gathered therefrom, the moneys payable to the official or employee will be credited to the General Fund.
