AN ACT Prohibiting Candidates from Notarizing an Absentee Ballot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 1254, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, additional. Subsection 1 of section 1254 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 163 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended by adding a new paragraph A, to read as follows.

A. Exception. A person, whose name appears on the ballot as a candidate, shall not be a proper official before whom an absentee voter must mark his ballot under this subsection.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit candidates from notarizing absentee ballots.
