COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 116, L. D. 136, Bill, "AN ACT Prohibiting Swimming or Bathing in Jordan Pond, Hancock County."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause, the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this would allow swimming in Jordan Pond, Hancock County during the summer months; and

Whereas, continued swimming could create a health hazard to the town whose drinking water is supplied by this lake; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement of Fact the following emergency clause:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to insure that this legislation will be effective for the summer of 1973.
