STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Publishing Rules and Regulations of the Parks and Recreation Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 602, sub-§ 3, amended. The last paragraph of subsection 3 of section 602 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Before promulgating such rules and regulations, they shall submit them to the Attorney General, and if he shall certify that in his opinion they are in conformity with the law, they shall thereupon, together with section 606, be published once a week for 2 successive weeks in a newspaper published in the towns or counties of this State wherein parks are located the State newspaper and posted in at least 3 conspicuous places in or about said park or parks whereupon they shall take effect, and a certificate of such publication and posting shall be executed by one of the members of said commission and filed with the Secretary of State, who shall record the same.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The expense of publication in papers of towns or counties runs between \$1500 and \$2000. It is felt that the posting of the rules and regulations as specified in the statute plus advertising in the State newspaper is much more effective. The statute requires that they be posted in at least 3 conspicuous places in or about said park or parks whereupon they shall take effect.
