STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Number of Lobster Traps on Trawls in Saco Bay and Westerly, Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4464, amended. Section 4464 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 4464. —Saco Bay; Cumberland County

It is unlawful to have on any trawl more than 3 lobster traps on one warp and buoy in that any part of Saco Bay west of and westerly to a line running 150° true from the center of Spurwink River in Searborough the active lighthouse at Two Lights in Cape Elizabeth to the Hue and Cry Buoy.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is reflected in the title.
