## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 106TH LEGISLATURE

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 64, L.D. 167, Bill, "AN ACT Providing for Deputy Clerks of the District Court."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 159." by inserting after the 3rd sentence the following underlined sentence: 'Whenever the clerk is unable to perform the duties of his office or so directs, his deputy shall have all the power and perform all the duties of clerk.'

Further amend said Bill in the 11th line (10th line in L.D.) by inserting after the word "and" the following underlined words:

'there is no deputy clerk authorized or available to exercise the powers and perform the duties of clerk and'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 15th, 16th and 17th lines (13th and 14th lines of L.D.) the underlined words "Whenever the clerk is unable to perform the duties of his office or so directs, his deputy shall have all the power and perform all the duties of clerk."
