# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

### AN ACT Providing for Deputy Clerks of the District Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4, § 159, amended. Section 159 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

### § 159. Clerks, clerical assistants; appointment; compensation

For each division and for the office of the Chief Judge, the Chief Judge shall appoint such clerks and deptuy clerks and employ such clerical assistants as may be necessary. Clerks, deputy clerks and clerical assistants shall be compensated as determined by the Chief Judge. If the business of any division does not require the full-time service of a clerk, the Chief Judge may appoint a part-time clerk for such division. Whenever a clerk is absent or temporarily unable to perform his duties as clerk and an existing or immediate session of the court renders it necessary, the judge may designate a clerk pro tempore who shall have the same powers and duties of the clerk.

Whenever the clerk is unable to perform the duties of his office or so directs, his deputy shall have all the power and perform all the duties of clerk.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit the Chief Judge of the District Court to appoint deputy clerks.
