# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Relating to Marking Absentee Ballots at a General Election.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 21, § 1254, sub-§ 7, additional.** Section 1254 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 7 to read as follows:

7. General election. Notwithstanding subsection 1, in voting at a general election an absentee voter must mark his ballot in the presence of 2 persons, not of the same political faith, one of whom shall be an official designated in subsection 1.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that absentee ballots must be marked before 2 persons, not of the same political faith.
