STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Service Retirement of State Mental Institution Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ G, additional. Subsection 4 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph G to read as follows:
 - G. Any member, who is an employee of a state mental institution or who works with the mentally retarded and who has at least 20 years of creditable service, may be retired on or after the attainment of age 50 on a service retirement allowance which is equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation.
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 5, § 1095, amended. Section 1095 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

Every employee who is an incumbent in a position described in section 1121, subsection 4, paragraph G shall contribute at the rate of $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ of earnable compensation.
