AN ACT Establishing the West Bath Game Sanctuary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2101, amended. Section 2101 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding alphabetically the following paragraph:

West Bath Game Sanctuary: No person shall at any time hunt, trap, catch, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or bird, except ducks, within the following described territory situated in the Town of West Bath in the County of Sagadahoc: Beginning at a place known as Berry's Mill, so called; thence running in a southerly direction along the Berry's Mill Road to Prince's Corner, so called; thence southerly by the Campbell Pond Road and the Meadowbrook Road to the Phippsburg town line; thence along the town line to the shore of Brigham's Cove in Winnegance Bay; thence southerly and westerly to Birch Point; thence northerly and easterly along said New Meadows River and Mill Cove to the point of beginning.
