# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

#### AN ACT to Amend the Maine Commercial Feed Law of 1971.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 7, § 712, sub-§§ 18-A and 18-B, additional. Section 712 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 77 of the public laws of 1971, is amended by adding two new subsections 18-A and 18-B, to read as follows:
- 18-A. Specialty pet. "Specialty pet" means any domesticated animal pet normally maintained in a cage or tank, such as, but not limited to, gerbils, hamsters, canaries, psittacine birds, mynahs, finches, tropical fish, goldfish, snakes and turtles.
- 18-B. Specialty pet food. "Specialty pet food" means any commercial feed prepared and distributed for consumption by specialty pets.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clarify, by adding a specific definition of a particular category, the intent of the law to cover all materials used as feed or mixing in feed except those specifically exempt by law or regulation.
