HOUSE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 136, L.D. 348, Bill, "AN ACT
Relating to Apportionment of Cost of Reconstruction of Railroad
Grade Separation Structures on Nonfederal Aid -- State Aid Highways."

Amend said Bill in section 2 by adding at the end the
following underlined sentence:

'As to any elimination or alteration made under this section, the
Department of Transportation may determine what work fairly and
properly should be regarded as highway construction.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to allow the Department of
Transportation to make the same determination as to what work
fairly and properly should be regarded as highway construction
under this bill, as it may now make, under the second paragraph
of section 13 of chapter 593 of the public laws of 1971, on state,
town or other state aid highways.
