AN ACT to Include Court Reporters under Unclassified State Officials' Salary Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 2, § 6, sub-§ 6-A, additional. Section 6 of Title 2 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 6-A, to read as follows:

6-A. The salaries of the following state officials and employees to no more than \$15,000:

Official Court Reporters.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 4, § 651, amended. The first sentence of the first paragraph of section 651 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 590 of the public laws of 1969, and as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court may appoint not more than 15 Official Court Reporters to serve for a term of 7 years, who shall report the proceedings in the Supreme Judicial Court and in the Superior Court and who shall be officials of the court to which they may from time to time be assigned by the Chief Justice, and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties ~~and each of whom shall receive from the State a salary of \$12,500 per year.~~
