COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to H. P. 336, L. D. 454, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Release and Discharge of Persons Acquitted
by Reason of Mental Disease or Mental Defect."

Amend said bill in the 4th line after the amending clause
(4th and 5th lines in L.D.) by striking out the underlined
words and punctuation "or psychologist, or both,"

Further amend said bill in the 5th line from the end of
the first paragraph after the amending clause (4th and 5th lines
of L.D.) by striking out the underlined words "or psychologist"

Further amend said bill in the 3rd line of the 5th paragraph
from the end before the Statement of Fact (same in L.D.) by
striking out the underlined words and punctuation "or psychologist,
or both,"

Further amend said bill in the 10th line of the 3rd paragraph
from the end before the Statement of Fact (11th line in L.D.)
by striking out the underlined words and punctuation "or psychologist,
or both," and in the 15th line (16th line in L.D.) by striking
out the underlined words "or psychologist"

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that only a
psychiatrist may report or give testimony concerning a
person's readiness for release or discharge pursuant to Title 15,
section 104.
