COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 351, L. D. 466, Bill, "AN ACT Prohibiting Hunting, Trapping and Fishing on Indian Lands by Non-Indians."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in place thereof the following:

'AN ACT Prohibiting Hunting and Trapping on Penobscot Indian Lands by Persons Other Than Penobscot Indians.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the last paragraph before the statement of fact and inserting in place thereof the following:

'B. It shall be unlawful for any person, except Penobscot Indians as defined in Title 22, chapter 1353, to hunt or trap on the Penobscot Indian lands, except by permission of land owners. Whoever violates this paragraph shall be punished by a fine of \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is clarify the language.
