STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Hunting, Trapping and Fishing on Indian Lands by Non-Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2401-B, sub-§ 7, ¶ B, additional. Subsection 7 of section 2401-B of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 409 of the public laws of 1971 and as amended by section 1 of chapter 471 of the public laws of 1971, is further amended by adding a new paragraph B, to read as follows:

B. It shall be unlawful for any person, except Indians as defined in Title 22, section 4701, to hunt, trap or fish on Indian reservation lands or waters. Whoever violates this paragraph shall be punished by a fine of \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.
