COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 377, L.D. 506, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish within the Department of Indian Affairs a Bureau of Indian Police."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§4716." of section 1 by striking out all of the 2nd underlined sentence and inserting in place thereof the following underlined sentence:

'The Commissioner of Indian Affairs shall appoint a chief of police, subject to approval of the advisory board.'

Further amend said Bill in subsection 1 of that part designated "§4716." of section 1 by striking out in the 9th line (7th line in L.D.) the underlined words "each of"

Further amend said Bill in subsection 1 of that part designated "§4716." of section 1 by inserting in the 11th line (9th line in L.D.) after the underlined word "State" the following underlined words: 'and tribal ordinances'

Further amend said Bill in subsection 2 of that part designated "§ 4716." of section 1 by striking out in the 1st and 2nd lines (1st line of L.D.) the underlined words "The Chief of Indian Police" and inserting in place thereof the following underlined words: 'The Commissioner of Indian Affairs, subject to the approval of the Indian Law Enforcement Advisory Board,'

Statement of Fact

This amendment is necessary to further upgrade and improve law enforcement on the Indian reservations.
