COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 377, L.D. 506, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish within the Department of Indian Affairs a Bureau of Indian Police."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "<u>§4716.</u>" of section 1 by striking out all of the 2nd underlined sentence and inserting in place thereof the following underlined sentence:

'The Commissioner of Indian Affairs shall appoint a chief of police, subject to approval of the advisory board.'

Further amend said Bill in subsection 1 of that part designated "<u>§4716.</u>" of section 1 by striking out in the 9th line (7th line in L.D.) the underlined words "each of"

Further amend said Bill in subsection 1 of that part designated "<u>§4716.</u>" of section 1 by inserting in the 11th line (9th line in L.D.) after the underlined word "<u>State</u>" the following underlined words: 'and tribal ordinances'

Further amend said Bill in subsection 2 of that part designated "<u>§ 4716.</u>" of section 1 by striking out in the 1st and 2nd lines (1st line of L.D.) the underlined words "<u>The Chief of Indian Police</u>" and inserting in place thereof the following underlined words: '<u>The</u> <u>Commissioner of Indian Affairs, subject to the approval of the Indian</u> Law Enforcement Advisory Board,'
