HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 379, L. D. 508, Bill, "AN ACT
Exempting Gas for Cooking and Heating in Homes from Sales Tax."

Amend said Bill in the Title by inserting after the word
"Homes" the words 'and Hotels'

Futher amend said Bill by striking out all of the 2nd paragraph
and inserting in place thereof the following:

'9. Coal, oil, wood and gas. Coal, oil, wood, gas and all other
fuels, except ~~gas-and~~ electricity, when bought for cooking and heating
in homes, hotels and apartment houses, and other buildings designed
both for human habitation and sleeping.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to put back into the law the
exemption from the sales tax for gas for use in hotels and apartment
houses.
