**AN ACT Relating to Borrowing Capacity of Community School District
Consisting of the Towns of Crystal, Dyer Brook, Island Falls, Merrill and
Smyrna.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the community school district consisting of the Towns of Crystal, Dyer Brook, Island Falls, Merrill and Smyrna has a critical need for new construction to consolidate their elementary and secondary schools; and

Whereas, the borrowing capacity of the district is insufficient to meet the needs of such construction; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Community school district consisting of the Towns of Crystal, Dyer Brook, Island Falls, Merrill and Smyrna authorized to borrow money. The school trustees of the community school district consisting of the Towns of Crystal, Dyer Brook, Island Falls, Merrill and Smyrna are authorized to borrow a sum of money not in excess of \$1,100,000. This authority is granted notwithstanding any other provision of the Revised Statutes, Title 20, to the contrary.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make it possible for the construction of a new facility for pupils in grades kindergarten through 12.
