STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for Compensation for Commissioners of Housing Authorities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 4602, sub-§ 1, ¶ C, amended. The first sentence of paragraph C of subsection 1 of section 4602 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 8 of chapter 470 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

A commissioner shall may receive $n\sigma$ compensation for his services but in the discretion of the appointing authority and shall be entitled to the necessary expenses, including traveling expenses, incurred in the discharge of his duties.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 4602, sub-§ 2, ¶ D, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of paragraph D of subsection 2 of section 4602 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 8 of chapter 470 of the public laws of 1969 is amended to read as follows:

An advisory board member or commissioner, except the director of the state authority, shall receive no compensation for his services, **but a commissioner may**, at the Governor's discretion, receive compensation but and shall be entitled to the necessary expenses, including traveling expenses, incurred in the discharge of his duties.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the Governor, in the case of the state authority, or the local governing body in the case of local authorities to set compensation for commissioners of housing authorities. There is no appropriation, the authorities being capable of providing payments as required.
