**RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Scarborough for Damage to Property
by Escapees from the Boys Training Center.**

Town of Scarborough; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$383.54 to be paid to the Town of Scarborough, as a full and final settlement of their claim against the State for property damage by escapees from the Boys Training Center.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On November 23, 1972, Officer Carter attempted to stop a 1963 Chevy II station wagon Reg. #663-120. This car had been stolen from Old Orchard Beach. In attempting to stop the car, the Police Cruiser was involved and damaged to the amount of \$383.54.

The subjects were — Dennis Splude and Brian Moore. The same subjects involved in the 2 breaks in October. They were then turned over to the Boys Training Center.

There have been many problems over the past years with escapees from the Boys Training Center and a large amount of damage resulting to the town and Scarborough residents. Because of the many problems involved and expense incurred, it is felt that the restitution should be made to the town for repairs on the Cruiser car.
