AN ACT Creating the Rangeley Plantation Sanctuary.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2101, amended. Section 2101 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the 27th paragraph a new paragraph to read as follows:

Rangeley Plantation Sanctuary: The following described tract or territory situated in Rangeley Plantation in the County of Franklin: Land of the Maine Conference Association of Seventh-Day Adventists, being more particularly bounded and described as follows: Bounded on the north by Rangeley Lake; on the west by land of one Schmolka; on the south by land now or formerly of the Oxford Paper Company; and on the east by land now or formerly of Mrs. Franklin B. Stahl and land now or formerly of A. K. Wyman, containing in all 500 acres, more or less, and being lots A, B, 12, 13 and portions of lots C and 14 in the east  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Township No. 3, Range 1. The commissioner may after notice and public hearing add adjacent property to said game sanctuary upon application of the owners of said adjacent property. If the commissioner determines that the public health and safety is threatened by diseased animals within the Rangeley Plantation Sanctuary, he may authorize the use of firearms or any other device he deems appropriate to eliminate said animals.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is reflected in the title.
