STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Creating the Jackson Wildlife Management Area, Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2154, amended. Section 2154 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding before the 4th paragraph from the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

Jackson Wildlife Management Area, Waldo County: Within the following described boundaries in the northwest corner of the Town of Jackson, Waldo County: Beginning at a point where the Troy-Jackson town line crosses the so-called Common Hill Road, southerly along the Common Hill Road to a red painted marker marking the southeast corner of the so-called Wingate property; thence westerly along the southern boundary of land now or formerly owned by Wingate and land now or formerly owned by Coburn to a red painted marker; thence southerly along the north-south boundary between the land of Coburn and land now or formerly owned by Ricker to a red painted marker; thence westerly to a red painted marker on the Jackson-Thorndike town line; thence northerly along the Jackson-Thorndike town line to the Troy-Jackson town line; thence easterly along the Troy-Jackson town line to the point of beginning. Hunting allowed on the above described area shall be by means of bow and arrow only.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would create a wildlife management area in the Town of Jackson, Waldo County and restrict it to bow and arrow hunting only.
