COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 456, L.D. 605, Bill, "AN ACT to Provide Free Hunting and Fishing Licenses to Maine Indians Excluded from Present Law."

Amend said Bill in the last line before the Statement of Fact by striking out the underlined words "one year" and inserting in place thereof the following underlined word and figure: '5 years'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to make all Micmac and Maliseet Indians who have lived in Maine at least 5 years eligible for receiving free hunting and fishing licenses. At present these licenses are only given to members of the Passamaquoddy and Penobscot Tribes.
