STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Permit Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries to Suspend Licenses for Violations of Private and Special Laws and Assault on Coastal Wardens.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 12, § 3752, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 3752 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 2. Length of period of suspension. On conviction of a violation of any provision of chapters 401 to 417, except as provided in subsection 1, or any regulation pertaining to sea and shore fisheries, or any private and special law enforced by this department, or any provisions under Title 17, sections 2952 and 2953 enforced by this department, the commissioner may suspend any and all of the offender's licenses and permits, and his right to obtain any and all such licenses and permits issued by the commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries as follows.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries now has no authority to suspend any license or permit issued by him for violations of any private and special law. Title 17, sections 2952 and 2953 are sections used for assault on, or interference with, or obstructing a coastal warden in the legal performance of his duties. To include this in the commissioner's authority would give him the base necessary to control any extenuating violations.
