STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Prohibit the Use of Unmarked Police Cars.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 7, amended. The last sentence of the 3rd paragraph of section 7 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 544 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

Motor vehicles used by departments, commissions or agencies charged by law with law enforcement or investigatory functions, if used for those purposes by personnel who have full-time law enforcement or investigatory duties, shall not be required to display a special registration plate but shall at all times plainly display an identifying marker or insignia approved by the Secretary of State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this legislation to prohibit the use of unmarked police cars.
