AN ACT Relating to Display of Lights on Certain Motor Vehicles During
the Daytime.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1071, amended. Section 1071 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new sentence to read as follows:

All motor trucks in excess of one ton load capacity or combination of motor vehicle and trailer or semitrailer, shall, while on any portion of a traveled way during daylight hours, be required to display lights in the same manner provided for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the purpose of this bill to require all drivers operating trucks with one ton or over carrying capacity and passenger cars hauling travel trailers, campers, mobile homes or any hauling trailer during the daytime hours to keep their headlights on.
