STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Creating a Drug Control Corps Within the State Police.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 25, § 1502-A, additional. Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1502-A, to read as follows:

§ 1502-A. Drug control corps

The Chief of the State Police is authorized to establish and maintain a Drug Control Corps. The specific powers and duties of the corps shall be to investigate and prosecute violators of any drug control law of the State and to arrest the offenders thereof, and to assist municipalities in their efforts to enforce the drug control laws.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated to the State Police for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974, the sum of \$38,636 from the General Fund and \$115,908 from the General Highway Fund, and for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975, the sum of \$35,045 from the General Fund and \$105,136 from the General Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
