STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Repealing Certain Definition of Timber and Grass Relating to the Public Lots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1903, c. 232, repealed. Chapter 232 of the public laws of 1903 is repealed as follows:

Section 7. The language 'Timber and Grass,' as relates to the public lots, so called, in unincorporated townships in state of Maine, is hereby construed to mean all growth of every description on said lots.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This old public law stated that "timber and grass" in public lots means all growth of every description. Because of changed circumstances it is no longer relevant.
