STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Increasing State Aid for Construction of Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 23, § 1101, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 1101 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

Towns having a valuation of \$500,000 or less may appropriate any amount not exceeding \$300; towns having a valuation of over \$500,000 and not over \$1,600,000 may appropriate any amount not exceeding \$533; towns having a valuation of over \$1,600,000 and not over \$2,000,000 may appropriate an amount not exceeding \$600; and towns having a valuation of over \$2,000,000 and not over \$6,000,000 may appropriate in addition to the sum of \$600 an additional sum of \$66 for each \$400,000 or fraction thereof valuation in excess of \$2,000,000; towns having a valuation of over \$6,000,000 and not over \$8,000,-000 may appropriate not exceeding \$1,333; and towns having a valuation of over \$8,000,000 and not over \$60,000,000 may appropriate in addition to the sum of \$1,333 an additional sum not exceeding \$133 for each additional \$2,000,-000 or fraction thereof of additional valuation; and towns having a valuation of over \$60,000,000 may appropriate in addition to the sum of \$1,333 an additional sum of \$133 for each \$2,000,000 valuation between \$8,000,000 and \$60,000,000 and may appropriate an additional sum not exceeding \$133 for each additional \$1,000,000 or fraction thereof of additional valuation in excess of \$60.000.000.

FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost to the General Highway Fund would amount to approximately \$225,500 per year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow larger municipalities in the State to generate a more significant state aid construction or reconstruction program.

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
