COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 652, L. D. 915, Bill,  
"AN ACT Revising the Laws Relating to Oil Burner Men's Licensing."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 2302." by striking out all of subsection 3 and inserting in place thereof the following:

'3. Plants. A person <sup>holding</sup> an engineer's license who has been examined under Title 26, section 178, performing such oil burner repair and maintenance as is necessary in the steam or heating plant where he is employed, provided such work is performed in compliance with section 2303.'

Further  
/amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 2304-A." by striking out in the first line of the 3rd paragraph (same in L.D.) the underlined figure and word "24 hours" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure and word '7 days'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§2351." in the 2nd paragraph by striking out in the 3rd line (same in L.D.) by striking out the underlined words "Heating Equipment"

Statement of Fact

Because of in-plant requirement, it is unnecessary for personnel in these plants to be licensed as an oil burner man. Twenty-four hours is too short a time. MOHEDA has changed its name.
