STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Hotel under Labor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 8, additional. Title 26 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 8 to read as follows:

Hotel defined § 8.

As used in any labor law, "hotel" means a commercial establishment offering lodging to transients and often having restaurants, public rooms, shops, etc., that are available to the general public; hostelry, hotel, motor hotel, house inn, resort, tourist court, motor court, cottage colony, tavern or any other establishment relating to the innkeeping industry that refers to establishments for the lodging or entertainment of travelers.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clear up the present wrong interpretation of the word hotel by the Bureau of Labor and Industry. This definition is taken from the dictionary.
