SENATE AMENDMENT "^B" to H. P. 827, L. D. 972, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Biennial Elections of the Passamaquoddy Tribes."

Amend said bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

'<u>Emergency preamble</u>. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the deficiencies and inconsistencies in the laws relating to biennial election of the Passamaquoddy Tribe should be corrected as soon as possible; and

Whereas, this bill provides for removal of tribal officers and provides for caucuses and provides for recounts in case of close elections; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary in order to prevent undue hardship on the members of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Further amend said bill by adding at the end before the Statement of Fact the following:

'<u>Emergency clause</u>. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'
