STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Litter under Maine Litter Control Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 17, § 2263, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 2263 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 405 of the public laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:
- 2. "Litter" means all waste materials including, but not limited to, any bottles, glass, crockery, cans, scrap metal, junk, paper, garbage, rubbish, offal, feathers old automobiles or parts thereof, or similar refuse, or disposable packages or containers thrown or deposited as prohibited in this chapter, but not including the wastes of the primary processes of mining, logging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to remove "feathers" from the definition of litter under the Maine Litter Control Act. It is impossible to keep live birds from shedding feathers while being transported.
