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**AN ACT** Relating to Membership on the Lewiston-Auburn Water  
Pollution Control Board.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1967, c. 92, § 14, repealed and replaced. Section 14 of chapter 92 of the private and special laws of 1967, as repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 113 of the private and special laws of 1969, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The director of the Lewiston department of public works and the superintendent of the Auburn Sewerage District shall be members of the board by virtue of their respective offices and in the event of the termination of their offices on the board of public works and Auburn Sewerage District they shall continue as members of the board of the authority until their replacements are elected or appointed. In addition, the members of the Lewiston board of public works and the trustees of the Auburn Sewerage District shall each elect one of their number to serve for a 2-year term on the board of the authority and thereafter until their successors take office. In the event that either of the members of the board so selected should cease to be a resident of his respective city, or should die, become incapacitated or otherwise cease to be a member of the Lewiston board of public works or the Auburn Sewerage District trustees, as the case may be, a successor shall be elected to serve for the remainder of the term in the same manner as members are elected to full 2-year terms on the board of the authority.

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1967, c. 92, § 14, repealed and replaced. The 2nd paragraph of section 14 of chapter 92 of the private and special laws of 1967, as enacted by section 4 of chapter 113 of the private and special laws of 1969, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The term of the incumbent president of the Auburn Sewerage District trustees as a member of the board of the authority shall expire and his successor shall assume his office at the annual meeting of the board to be held in January, 1974. Reasonable notice of the date of the meeting and of the necessity for electing a new member to the board of the authority, who may be the incumbent, shall be given to the Auburn Sewerage District by the secretary or clerk of the authority.
