STATE OF MAINE SENATE 106TH LEGISLATURE

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 338, L. D. 1037, Bill, "AN ACT to Permit the State Board of Education to Reimburse the City of Portland for School Construction."

Amend said bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, if enacted as a regular Act of the Legislature the school department of the City of Portland would not be able to apply to the State Board of Education for school subsidy for the fiscal year 1971 - 1972 until much later in this year; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, this would work a financial hardship upon the school system and citizens of Portland; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement of Fact the following emergency clause:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

The purpose of this amendment is to add an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill.
