STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing a Pension for Raymond E. Thurston of Union.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Raymond E. Thurston of Union, who is about 88 years of age, has rendered valuable service as a state and county official; and

Whereas, to prevent undue hardship the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide Mr. Thurston with some of the bare necessities of life; and

Whereas in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Raymond E. Thurston; pension provided. Resolved: That a pension of \$80 per month be granted to Raymond E. Thurston of Union to be paid monthly as a special legislative pension.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is reflected in the emergency preamble.
