STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Increasing Membership in Municipal Conservation Commissions, Housing Authorities and Renewal Authorities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30. § 3851, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 3851 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 3-A of chapter 394 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

The municipal officers may appoint 5 conservation commissioners not more than 7 conservation commissioners, to hold office 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 years, respectively, and after the first year choose annually a commissioner for 5 years in place of the one whose term expires.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 4602, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, amended. The first sentence of paragraph A of subsection 1 of section 4602 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 8 of chapter 470 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

Each authority shall have 5 no more than 7 commissioners appointed.

Sec. 3. R. S., T. 30, § 4803, sub-§ 1, amended. The first sentence of subsection 1 of section 4803 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The municipal officers shall appoint a board of trustees of the Urban Renewal Authority which shall consist of 5 7 trustees.
