SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 799, L. D. 1069, Bill,
"AN ACT Raising the Age of Persons Who May Purchase Alcoholic
Beverages or Sell as Licensees."

Amend said Bill in the title by inserting after the word "Purchase" the words 'or Transport'

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out in the 6th, 9th, 12th and 15th lines (5th, 7th, 9th and 12th lines in L. D.) the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Bill in section 2 by striking out in the 6th line (5th line in L. D.) the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Bill in section 3 by striking out in the 13th and last lines (10th and last lines in L. D.) the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Bill in section 4 by striking out in the 6th and 7th lines (5th and 6th lines in L. D.) the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end before the Statement of Fact the following:

'Sec. 5. R. S., T. 28, § 1001, amended. The first sentence, as amended, and the first sentence of the last paragraph, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 352 of the public laws of 1967 and as amended, of section 1001 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, are further amended to read as follows:

(Lilling Mo. \$ - 169)

No person under the age of $\frac{10}{10}$ years shall knowingly transport or knowingly permit to be transported any intoxicating liquor in a motor vehicle under his control except in the scope of his or her employment, or at the request of his or her parent or quardian.

No person under the age of ±8 19 years shall be convicted of any offense under this section if intoxicating liquors are found outside the passenger or driver's section of a motor vehicle under his control unless said person has actual knowledge of the presence of said liquors.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to raise the age of persons who may purchase alcoholic beverages or sell as licensees to 19 years and to conform illegal transportation to legal age of purchase.
