STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Membership on the State Board of Barbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 351, amended. The 3rd sentence of the first paragraph of section 351 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The tenure of each barber member of the board shall be for 2 years and no barber member shall serve on the board for more than 2 consecutive terms.

- Sec. 2. Effective date. Section I shall become effective as the term of the current board members expire.
- Sec. 3. R. S., T. 32, § 351, amended. The 4th sentence of the first paragraph of section 351 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Thereafter, each of the barber members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, for a term of $\frac{3}{2}$ years and until his successor is appointed and qualified.

Sec. 4. R. S., T. 32, § 351, amended. The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 351 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The chairman of the board shall be elected by the barber members of the board.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this legislation is to promote greater participation on the part of Maine barbers who wish to promote their profession and the improvement of services and quality within the State of Maine. It has been the practice in the past that membership on the board of barbers has been limited to the barbers who wish to serve, because of long service by previous state board members. This legislation will correct this obvious limitation.
