STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Increasing Retirement Benefit for Mrs. Nathalie Kinnear of Bristol

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide Mrs. Nathalie Kinnear of Bristol with a retirement allowance adjustment of $11\frac{1}{2}\%$; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Mrs. Nathalie Kinnear of Bristol; retirement allowance adjustment. Resolved: That notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the Maine State Retirement System is directed to provide an $11\frac{1}{2}$ % retirement allowance adjustment to Mrs. Nathalie Kinnear of Bristol. Such amount shall be computed by the Board of Trustees of the Retirement System.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On June 17, 1972 Mrs. Kinnear retired from teaching following 38 years of service to Maine youngsters. Having failed to file a letter of intent as required

under section 1128 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, Mrs. Kinnear was deprived of a retirement allowance adjustment provided under this section. The letter of intent was not filed due to any negligence on her part, therefore, the adjustment is sought in good faith.
