AN ACT Relating to Union School Meetings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 20, § 523, additional. Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 523 to read as follows:

§ 523. Meetings; quorum

At any school union meeting in order for a quorum to exit, at least 2 members must be present from each school union town.

Special meetings may be called only by the chairmen of the respective school committees of each town with the approval of a majority of each school committee.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for representation from all towns at any school union meeting.
