COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 389, L.D. 1135, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Membership on the Advisory Board of the Department of Commerce and Industry."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 6th line (5th line in L.D.) the underlined figure "9" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '8'

Further amend said Bill by striking out the last underlined sentence before the Statement of Fact (same in L.D.) and inserting in place thereof the following 2 underlined sentences:

'The Governor shall appoint one member from each of the 8 economic districts as established by the Department of Commerce and Industry. The term of the member appointed to the advisory council to fill the vacancy created by increasing the membership from 7 to 8 shall be coterminous with the term of the member or successor member to the term first appointed for a term of one year.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment sets the number of advisory council members at 8 and provides that each of Maine's economic districts shall be represented.
