STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Membership on the Advisory Board of the Department of Commerce and Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 10, § 404, amended. The first sentence of section 404 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 584 of the public laws of 1971, is further amended to read as follows:

A Department of Commerce and Industry Advisory Council, as heretofore established, shall consist of \neq 9 members appointed by the Governor for a term of 3 years, provided that of the members first appointed, one shall be appointed for a term of one year, 3 for a term of 2 years and 3 for a term of 3 years. The terms of the 2 members appointed to the advisory council to fill the vacancies created by increasing the membership from 7 to 9 shall be coterminous with the term of the member or successor member to the term first appointed for a term of one year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill would be to increase the membership in the Department of Commerce and Industry Advisory Council from its current 7 members to a 9-member board allowing the appointment of one member from each of Maine's 8 economic districts and a chairman.
