STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Trespass on Lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 3855, amended. The first sentence of section 3855 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 32 of the public laws of 1971, is further amended to read as follows:

Whoever willfully enters on or passes over the garden, orchard, mowing land or other enclosed or cultivated land of another, after being forbidden to do so by the owner or occupant of said land or his agent, either personally or by notice posted conspicuously on the premises without prior permission from the owner or occupant of said land or his agent, is guilty of trespass and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require permission to enter upon enclosed or cultivated land.
