STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Posting Notices or other Communication on Lands of Another.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 3860, additional. Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3860 to read as follows:

§ 3860. Posting notices and other materials

Whoever willfully places or causes to be posted or placed upon lands, buildings or structures of another a notice, sign or other communications or materials without the permission of the owner or occupant thereof, shall be guilty of trespass and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50. Any person found in violation of this section who is employed by the State shall upon conviction forfeit one week's salary.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this bill to prohibit placing notices, signs and other material on trees, buildings, fences or other structures without first obtaining necessary permission from the owner of said property.
