STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Vacation and Sick Leave Pay for County Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 20, § 801, amended. The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 801 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The county commissioners may establish reasonable office hours for offices in the county building and provide for a county pay scale for clerical help, with paid vacations of 2 weeks per year after at least a year's service and with paid vacations of 3 weeks per year after at least #5 10 years' service.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 801, amended. The last paragraph of section 801 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding before the last sentence the following new sentence:

Upon retirement, unused sick leave shall be paid to the county employee as follows: Three weeks pay after at least 10 years of service and 4 weeks pay after at least 20 years of service.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for paid vacations for county employees after certain years of service and to provide payments to county employees who on retirement have accumulated sick leave.
