AN ACT Relating to Use of Red Pen or Pencil in Counting Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 925-A, additional. Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 925-A, to read as follows:

§ 925-A. Use of red pens or pencils

Any person engaged at a primary or general election as an election clerk, assistant election clerk or any person employed as a counter of ballots shall use pens or pencils containing only red ink or red lead.
