AN ACT Relating to Count Limit of Shrimp.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, c. 417, sub-c. II, Article 5-A, additional. Subchapter II of chapter 417 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new Article 5-A, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 5-A. SHRIMP

§ 4063. Count limit

It is unlawful for any person to land, transport or process live, whole shrimp (*Pandalus borealis*) exceeding a count of 85 per pound during the calendar year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is reflected in the title and is to conserve the shrimp resource.
